- 2. Complete the <u>Chapter 26 Key Terms and People</u>
- 3. Complete the LEQ using the instructions provided.

NOT REQUIRED, but strongly encouraged:

- 4. Consider completing the first half of the <u>KEY TERMS EXAM REVIEW PACKET</u> review major concepts from US I honors while it is "fresh."
- 5. You should print this out and have a paper copy rather than a digital copy.
 - a. You are entering the SECOND HALF of the two-year AP US History course; meaning you are expected to remember and will be assessed on information you learned in US1 until the day you complete the AP US History exam -May 2026.

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Assignment #3

In your response you should do the following.

• Respond to the LEQ [long essay question] prompt in a FIVE PARAGRAPH essay. The formatting for a five paragraph essay is fairly straightforward: Introduction with a clear thesis statement (1), three body paragraphs (2-4), and a conclusion (5). The rubric that I will be using to grade the essay is accessible here. For the purposes of this assignment, I waive the "outside source" requirement. You are limited to the textbook and your general knowledge of the topic and should not cite anything other than the text. That said, there shouldn't be many direct quotes at all.

• Write your response <u>neatly</u> on lined paper. <u>PLEASE REMEMBER</u>... if I cannot read your words (handwriting) <u>then I cannot assess your work</u> (it receives no credit).
