## Personal History:

<u>1954</u>. Growing up in a family of eight, Joowon was the middle child and the only boy, which felt like the ultimate misfortune.

His mother, obsessed with having daughters, constantly reminded him that he didn't belong, that he was a mistake by God, and that he should have been either dead or a girl. In his early childhood, he was forced to dress like a girl. His mother wouldn't allow him to cut his hair, making him grow it out like a girl's. ### The Curse:

#### The Present:

Currently, Joowon works as a full-time model, his schedule overflowing with endless photoshoots. As the years passed, he grew somewhat distant from Sook-ju, each of them pursuing their own lives. Despite this, Joowon remains unaware of Wonjoo's existence. He is, however, conscious of his memory gaps and the occasional 'accidental' sleepwalking episodes.
