What is Academic Integrity?

Academic integrity is an ethical choice that students must make. It is a commitment to honesty, trust, fairness, respect, responsibility, and courage. It means:

- **Doing your own work:** This means completing assignments, tests, and projects on your own, without copying from others or using generative AI tools without permission.
- **Giving credit where credit is due:** This means properly citing information you use from other sources, including those created by generative AI.
- Not lying or cheating: This includes things like looking at someone else's test, making up data for a project, or using technology irresponsibly.
