Current Building PD Focus:

<u>LETRS -</u> We began our coaching cycles with the LETRS AEA instructors this month. Teams of 3 o4 teachers were together to talk about implementation, specifically how our 95% group phonics work for all 3rd and 4th graders matches what we are learning in the LETRS professional development. I sat in on a couple of sessions and as always am amazed by the thoughtful questions that the teachers ask. They want to make sure they "know their stuff" and are helping students to be the best readers possible!!!!

The new teachers at West (Wegner, Fornoff, Underwood, Jensen and Joyce) have started their Vol. I (unit 1 and 2) training that all of the veteran teachers at West completed last year. The AEA has provided the service to us so that all of our teachers in NE and West will have the same basic understanding of how students learn to read and write and what do we do if they struggle in either area.

PBIS- A portion of the PBIS lead team received additional training on Tier 2 interventions for PBIS. On Sept. 16 teachers virtually attended training on intervening for students who need more support for following our school wide expectations (or classroom expectations). This Tier 2 level of support is how we work with students who may have traditionally been looked at for services through an IEP. The team will meet again in Oct. to flush out the details of working with a select group of students.

Implementation Expectations:

LETRS Teachers are to pick 3 students for their case study that will be carried out through the year. They select a student who is working above grade level, on grade level and below grade level to assess and then instruct (some with whole group, and some in small groups or as individuals). We will be looking specifically at how our students are progressing with the implementation of 95% group phonics. This work will not only impact a students ability to problem solve unknown words- decoding, but we should see an improvement in their ability to write/spell- encoding.


