Intelligent Mischief is a creative studio unleashing Black imagination to shape the future.. Our purpose is to boost invention and imagination, re-align action logic, and experiment with new forms of civil society to create atmospheres of change. HOPES

APPROACH

Phase 1: Read

Take the time to savor the gifts that our ancestors and beloveds have conjured up in these texts and other offerings. Read for pleasure. Read for connection. Read for self care. Read as exodus. . And, if you can, read together with others. Share what you're discovering, what's being sparked and what is expanding your imaginations and your innate feelings and assumptions about what is possible.

Phase 2: Digest and make meaning. As you read, jot down what's percolating and the potential meaning and implications, Write down your inspiration, and most importantly capture the ideas that pop up in conversation with the texts.

Phase 3: Create. Make, write,, adorn yourself, dance, write music, draw, embody what you are discovering in new practices of self love, of Black love. Of certainty that our imaginations have power to shape the future.
