The *abstract* must be no more than 300 words and should be concise and include only the most important aspects of the study. The abstract should be a single paragraph and should follow the style of structured abstracts, but without headings: 1) Introduction: Place the question addressed in a broad context and highlight the purpose of the study; 2) Materials and methods: Describe briefly the main methods or treatments applied. Include any relevant preregistration numbers, and species and strains of any animals used. 3) Results and discussion: Summarize the article's main findings & discuss the result; and 4) Conclusions: Indicate the main conclusions or interpretations. The abstract should be an objective representation of the article: it must not contain results which are not presented and substantiated in the main text and should not exaggerate the main conclusions. The title of the abstract should be written in the center of the field using regular font 11 pt bold. The space between the title of the abstract and the name of the institution is one single space 10 pt. The abstract is written using times news roman font 11 pt in a single column format. Keywords are written below the text of the abstract, arranged alphabetically and separated by comma. The title of the keywords should be written using italic font 10 pt bold, while the keywords should be written using regular font 10 pt.

Introduction

Article should be written in A4 paper. The article should be without any page numbering and composed as follows: Abstract, Introduction, Research Methodology (or Model Development), Result and Discussion, Conclusion, Acknowledgements (if any), List of Notation (if any), and Bibliography

Content.

The article should be written using MS Word using Template article format. Each article should be no more than 15 pages (including pictures and tables) justified, and should end in an even page number.

Pictures and Tables

Pictures and tables placed in a text with description. Pictures and tables is followed by the title of the picture placed just below the picture and the title of the table placed above the table. The title of the table and picture should be numbered. The picture should be able to be clearly printed. Pictures or diagrams/ schemes placed in the text or if the picture is too big, it can be placed in the middle of the page. The picture should not be framed. The displayed tables are without vertical line, whereas horizontal lines can only display 3 main horizontal lines which are 2 horizontal lines for column title and closing line from the bottom line.

Equation

Equation should be written left aligned and numbered in the brackets. The numbers placed at the end of the right margin of the column.

List of Notation arranged alphabetically. Notation of latin alphabet should be written first followed by Arabic alphabet.

Quotation

Quotation writing of an article should be written using Harvard system. The source is written in the description consists of the name of the author and the year of publication. Example: Lignocellulosic hydrolysis can be carried out with enzymes and chemistry [1]. According to Damayanti (2008) report that fermentation using yeast *Saccharomyces cerevisiae* can convert glucose into bioethanol [1].

Materials and methods

Text (Times New Roman, 11 pt, Tab 0.8 cm)

Tables

Tables are sequentially numbered with the table title and number above the table. Tables should be centered in the column OR on the page. Tables should be followed by a line space (11pt). Elements of a table should be single-spaced, however double spacing can be used to show groupings of data or to separate parts within the table. Table headings should be in 10pt bold. Tables are referred in the text by the table number without location (above, below, following, etc.), e.g.: Table 1. Do not show vertical line in the table. There is only horizontal line should be shown within the table.

Figures or diagrams/ schemes placed in the text or if the picture is too big, it can be placed in the middle of the page. The picture should not be framed. 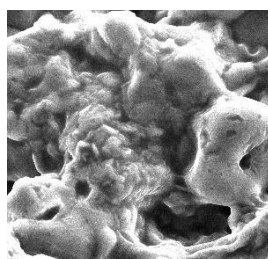


Figure 1. Scanning Electron Microscope.
