Articulation Agreement

Between Harding University and Crowley's Ridge College

In fall 2022 a memorandum of understanding (hereinafter "MOU") was entered into by and between Harding University (hereinafter "HU") located at 915 E. Market Avenue, Searcy, AR 72149-5615 and Crowley's Ridge College (hereinafter "CRC") located at 100 College Drive, Paragould, AR 72450. Over time, university requirements change, course codes change, and program requirements change, therefore, adjustments need to be made to individual articulation agreements attached to the original MOU. Additionally, other programs may want to create articulation agreements.

The purpose of this document is to acknowledge the addition of an articulation agreement and the changes being made to previous articulation agreements between HU and CRC. New and updated documents effective for the 2025-2026 school year are attached.

If either party wishes to terminate this agreement they must do so in writing one year in advance of their requested termination date.
