

## **MVHS AVID INFORMATION**



**AVID** program at Monte Vista High School. **AVID** (**Advancement Via Individual Determination**) is a 4-year elective class offered to students who would like to prepare for entrance into a 4-year university directly after high school. This course counts towards college as a "G" elective. Acceptance to the AVID program requires completion of an application process and criteria taken into consideration for all applicants include: GPA, interview, citizenship, attendance, state test scores, and recommendations.

The AVID curriculum features expository reading, writing, inquiry, collaboration, note-taking, study skills, research skills, and college/career activities. Curriculum centers on themes such as leadership, ethics, community service, and post-secondary success. AVID students participate in biweekly tutorials centered on higher level questions from their content classes. AVID students get organized and take notes in classes on a daily basis. As AVID students continue through high school, they are expected to strive for high academic achievement, take rigorous courses including AP/honors courses, and to develop soft skills including organization, time management, collaboration, and communication. #### The typical AVID Student Profile:

- Mid range GPA 2.5 3.7: (A's, B's, & C's)
- CAASPP test scores of Met or Exceeds Standard
- Desire to improve academic skills and pursue AVID as a four year commitment
- Future and/or current co-enrollment in AP, honors and college prep courses
- Reclassified EL students with academic potential
- An understanding that the student is required to complete and participate in course's workload

#### What we also look for:

- Students with post-secondary goals
- First generation, historically underrepresented group
- PERSONAL desire, motivation & determination to improve academics and participate in collaborative activities and course load
- Displays proper classroom behavior
- Desire to develop better executive functioning skills- willing to use planner, focused note taking formats
- Desire to develop growth mindset
