SummerWorks expands the possibilities of performance. In its 32nd year, our summer Festival, based in Toronto, Canada, is widely recognized as one of the most vital platforms for launching new performance in the country. **We are currently seeking proposals for our Festival's next edition, taking place August 4th-14th, 2022.** Proposals are encouraged from established and emerging creators, as well as curators, working across all disciplines and artistic traditions. In-person, digital, and hybrid performance projects will be considered.

SummerWorks Presentations programming considers proposals for new projects that will be ready for full presentation in August 2022. We are interested in works and artists that tackle urgent and complex questions of our time; that celebrate curiosity, wonder and adventure; and that expand the possibilities of what performance can be.

Works for in-person theatre, gallery, outdoor, and non-traditional settings are welcome, as are proposals for online, site-specific, and immersive contexts. Proposed works should have some previous development or presentation history. Projects curated from this call will be provided a guaranteed fee of \$1,000 CAD to \$7,500 CAD (depending on the scale of the project and number of performances).

Founded in 1996 as District Productions, Inc. with the purpose of presenting The Centennial Anniversary of The District, more commonly known as "Storyville" in 1997 (a 6 week array of lectures, cemetery tours, musical presentations, plays and exhibitions), it has been my intention to preserve the historical significance and memory of The District through continued research to provide historically accurate and entertaining presentations depicting the life and times of this popularized area in New Orleans history. Reinvented as DistrictProductionsNOLA in 2015 for the purpose of presenting The Centennial Anniversary of the Closing of The District in 2017, the initial premise was condensed into one 3 day-weekend of collaborative lectures, plays, music, jazz history tours, readings and ongoing 6 week pharmacy, art, period clothing & artifact exhibitions. Expanded research and writing was at the helm of the collaborations, which further stretched the scope of what District Productions NOLA can create and present.

It is the intention of District Productions NOLA to have it's first Canadian show premiere in Toronto at Summerworks. Written in collaboration with pianist Roberta Hunt, whose band Red Hot Ramble has successfully been bringing New Orleans based music to Canada since ?? The show will spotlight thirteen female jazz innovators whose lives spanned from the mid 1880's up to 1998. Their contributions in crafting what is known as Traditional or Dixieland Jazz has worldwide appeal, but less is known of these players than is of their male counterparts, and some are still less than lesser known, but collectively the life and times of these groundbreaking "Baker's Dozen" of female musicianship, musical venue ownership, and musical family relationships are sure to please through their stories and their tunes.
