a. **SPSA Review - Dashboard Analysis**

Presentation by Tia Ewig:

Tia went over the new data released in January on the 2022-2023 school data.

70.7 percent socioeconomically disadvantaged students, 18 percent English learners. No significant change in sub groups race/ethnicity.

Looking at the data we are green meaning we met we improved in Ela. We also made some improvements in Mathematics.

Absenteeism and tier reengagement will be the focus to support students.Math and Ela scores are an area of concern. Intervention strategies are in place to support improvement. Contracting with FEV to provide one on one tutoring and implement Tier 3 intervention strategies in classes. Math tutoring has also been implemented to support students in math.

Suspension rate has increased. To support this area we will continue to focus on PBIS strategies and creating a positive environment for our students.

English Learner population is too low to report any data. We will continue to use best practices for language development and acquisition for the entire student population. Hispanic students have scored above the standard and have surpassed the overall student population.

Math has increased, but we are still below our goal. Hispanic and African American Students have increased. Math is an area of focus for all significant subgroups. Math interventions will continue to be used and will be evaluated to determine the most effective strategies. FEV tutoring will continue to be implemented to support students in Ela and Math.
