ON THE QUESTION: Interim Police Chief Murray noted Ms. Patti cleared the background check, and that she had served as a crossing guard previously. There is a shortage now of matrons, he added.

- Mayor Hogan noted the official receipt of Fire Chief Kelly's intent to retire on June 30, 2007. The Mayor praised Chief Kelly, saying, "He built the fire department into what it is today. He insisted on quality, that his men be well-equipped and appropriate housing for the department. He worked with me to revamp the ambulance service from a ne'er-do-well to a top-flight emergency services paramedic staff." Mayor Hogan added that he personally finds it difficult to lose his longtime, trusted police and fire chiefs, due to retirement, within a few months of each other. Chief Kelly thanked the Board and said his accomplishments were due to the men who worked for him. The City will work of an existing Civil Service list for a replacement. An official resolution accepting Chief Kelly's retirement will go before the Board in June.
