- VP: Review Senate Job descriptions

- SSB 019-001: Appointment of Executive Cabinet

  - Alex asks all execs why they feel they are qualified for the position
    - Aryelle Jacobsen, Executive of Community Engagement- she works for the Key Center, has grown up her whole life in Asheville, runs a student action chapter in

Asheville, received her gold award and published a book on mental health for middle schoolers and feels she is passionate and qualified to fulfil the role

- Jessica Villatoro, Executive of Academic Affairs- she has worked with community, wants to be able to offer better courses to the student body, and she feels that she is capable of being able to make improvements to courses offered at UNC Asheville.
- Stephanie Grice, Executive of Diversity and Inclusion- She is the president of BSA, used to be the executive of multicultural affairs and has experience being an executive, has been the director of marketing and education, feels she understands the needs of the students, and cares deeply for this subject matter.
- Chase Loudermelt, Executive of the Association of Student Governments Liaison- She is part of political science club, a fellow of campus vote- what stood out to her about this position was the involvement the position had in voter registration, and voter outreach which she has personal expertise in, and she wants to be able to communicate with other campuses within the UNC system.
