Dear Church Family and Friends,

During a recent sermon, I referenced Stephen Covey’s Book, “The 7 Habits of Highly Effective People.” Why did I mention it? Because being effective is something I highly value. I’ve always gotten satisfaction out of discerning priorities, making improvements and evolving to meet the changes of life.

What do you value? The reason I ask is: What you value gives meaning to life. It helps determine how you make decisions. If what you do is meaningful, it brings satisfaction and reason to being here on earth.

Finding value in our pursuits makes them carry weight. It adds to the importance of doing. Ask yourself, “How much am I present and contributing to activities of daily life?” Ask because you can’t only give, you must receive.

I’ve learned that for many of you, spending time with family is a huge priority. It’s what you value most. It holds great meaning. For many of us, the number of people we count as biological family

has dwindled. As a result, we must choose to find others with whom we can form close bonds.

The members and friends of Messiah and St. Peter Lutheran Churches *are* bonded in special ways. You share long histories and many strands of connection: You are brothers and sisters in Christ, have attended school together, raised children of similar age, experienced joys and sorrows, gains and losses throughout your lives.

God knows, there’s a real threat to becoming isolated and alone. In Gen 2:8 the Lord God said, “It is not good that man [this person whom I have created] should be alone. [And in that moment, immediately, “God made [the new creature] a helper fit for them.”

God did that knowing the earth was already full of animals and the beauty of nature. (Those were value-added enhancements, not the core source of help for humanity.) The core strategy for getting through life well comes from God through relationships to/with each other and being authentic to self.

*Think about what you choose to do.
Does it add value and enhance your existence?*

Do you participate and contribute willingly?

If not, what value does it hold?

Is it an investment toward someone else or the future? Who do your efforts benefit and how?

I recently bought a wooden pen because I like what's engraved along the side in italicized cursive. In lettering burned brown against an oak-stained background, it reads, "Now is all we have."

Each day is full of opportunities to decide how to spend time, energy and other resources even if you may be thinking, "I don't get to decide how to spend my time, energy and resources." Why is that? Does what you're doing align with your values? Does it feel authentic to your needs and desires? Who or what motivates you to continue?

In a world where many things are out of our control, I invite you to attend church services as often as possible. You may or may not already value what happens there, but I promise you: Value and meaning exist in God's Word. Value and meaning exist in the liturgy we share and the faces of each other. Come. Participate, contribute and discover something new as members of one body of Christ and your God-given church family.
