Welcome to DictionaryX. We are committed to protecting your privacy. This Privacy Policy explains how we collect, use, disclose, and safeguard your information when you use our Chrome extension, DictionaryX. Please read this privacy policy carefully. If you do not agree with the terms of this privacy policy, please do not use the extension.

Information We Collect

DictionaryX collects minimal information to operate effectively. The information we collect includes:

1. Personal Data

We do not collect any personal data such as your name, email address, or contact details.

2. Usage Data

We may collect non-personal information about your use of the extension, such as:

- The words you double-click on for definitions.
- User settings and preferences.
- Feedback provided through the extension.

How We Use Your Information

We use the information we collect in the following ways:

- To provide and maintain the functionality of the extension.
- To improve and personalize your user experience.
- To understand how users interact with the extension and improve it.
- To respond to your feedback and provide support.

Sharing Your Information

We do not sell, trade, or otherwise transfer your information to outside parties. Your data is not shared with third-party services, except as necessary to provide the core functionality of the extension (e.g., fetching definitions from online dictionaries).

Data Security

We use administrative, technical, and physical security measures to help protect your personal information. While we have taken reasonable steps to secure the information you provide, please be aware that despite our efforts, no security measures are perfect or impenetrable, and no method of data transmission can be guaranteed against any interception or other type of misuse.
