4. (10) Using FRED data, construct a table of annual labor force participation rate by age and sex category, 15-24, 25-54, 55-64 for both men and women in the United States.
5. (10) Using FRED data, construct a table of annual labor force participation rate by education category, less than high school, high school grads no college, some college, and college grads or more.
6. (10) Using the state data, construct a table of the real output per worker for each census division. Use the following years as entry positions: 1840, 1860, 1880, 1900, 1920, 1940, 1950, 1960, 1970, 1980, 1990 and 2000.
7. (10) Using the state data, construct a table of the children ever born for whites and blacks for each census division. Use the following years as entry positions: 1840, 1860, 1880, 1900, 1920, 1930, 1940, 1950, 1960, 1970, 1980, 1990 and 2000.
8. (10) Using the state data, construct a table of the years of schooling for each birth cohort of whites and blacks for each census division. Use the following years as entry positions: 1840, 1860, 1880, 1900, 1920, 1930, 1940, 1950, 1960, 1970, 1980, 1990 and 2000.
