SOLIDARITY BY LUCY PARKER



A film about the secretive methods used against UK activists and trade unionists. In the film blacklisted construction workers and activists spied on by the police share their ongoing struggles.

Solidarity had its International Premiere at International Documentary Festival Amsterdam in November 2019 and won the Competition for First Appearance for first time feature filmmakers.

This followed its **World Premiere at Sheffield Docs Fest** in June; London Premiere at Open City Docs Festival Solidarity (which both sold out) and a continuing UK Cinema Tour.

Most screenings with **Q&A's with Director**, members of **Blacklist Support Group**, featured activists, politicians, legal professionals or core participants of the **Undercover Policing Inquiry**.
