If you plan to attend the first session of the day, please arrive promptly when doors open to give yourself enough time to collect your wristband, navigate to the room where your session is occurring and find your seat. 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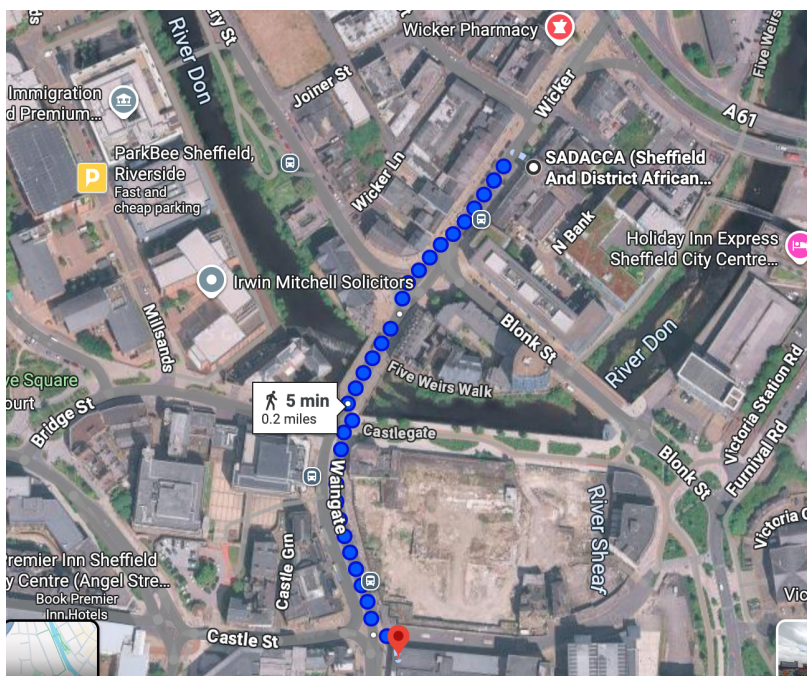
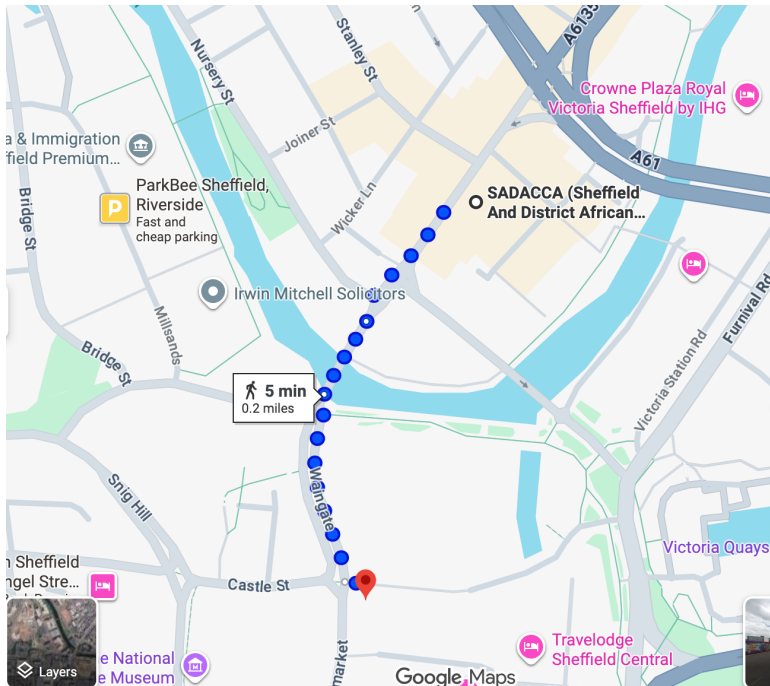

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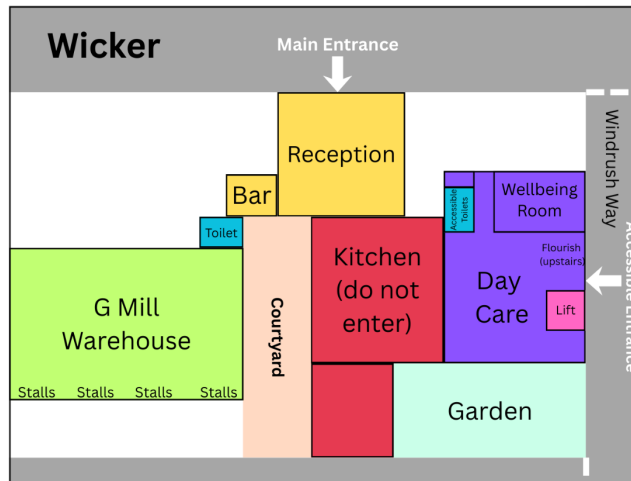

How to get between SADACCA (48 Wicker, S3 8JB) or Raccoon Studios (4 Exchange St, S2 5TS):

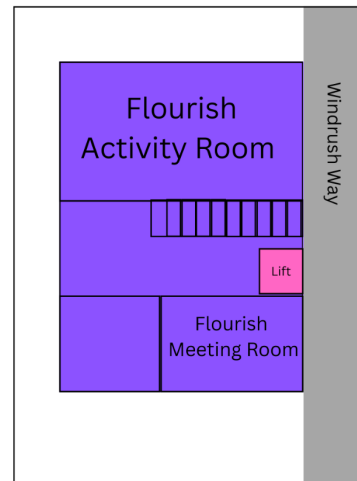


Raccoon Studios is a 5 minute walk, 5 minutes drive, and 1 minute cycle from SADACCA
