Bar Parisette is named for a forest berry known in French as *raisin de renard* ('fox grape'). In the fable *The Fox and the Grapes*, a hungry fox tries to reach a bunch of grapes. When he realizes they are too high to reach, the fox declares they were too sour to eat anyway, giving us the English phrase *sour grapes*.



The fox's story is not unlike the experience of chasing our favorite bottles over the last few years as wine prices have skyrocketed. Standard Chicago restaurant markups are at least 3-4 times wholesale cost, so sour grapes are all too common.

We understand why those markups are the norm here – restaurants are expensive as hell to run – but our mission at Bar Parisette is to put special bottles within your reach, as they are in places like Paris or Montreal. To facilitate that, most of our wine bottles are priced at roughly half the normal restaurant markup. Our list includes great bottles from our favorite producers at every price point, as well as deep cuts and older wines.

We want you to drink great wine because we love great wine, we love you, and we love the magic of great food, great wine, and great company coming together. We're betting that you will love us enough that we can do a crazy thing like sell half-priced wine every night and still pay our bills. So tell your friends, buy that second bottle, order dessert.

If you're up for a little adventure, head down the steps behind the host stand to check out our "grab bag" cooler. It's stocked with one-offs, end-of-bins and hidden gems, all at amazing prices.

One of my great wine memories is finding an off-list bottle of Veyder Malberg Brandstatt Riesling tucked away in a cooler at a restaurant in rural Austria, the night after a tasting with the winemaker himself. When I asked if we could open the bottle, the proprietors smiled and grabbed glassware.

If you've ever been to Bacchanal in New Orleans (or great Chicago spots like Red & White and All Together Now), you know the drill. Reach in and grab what you like. Prices are marked on the bottle. Take a bottle home or to a party, or drink it here. No sour grapes.

ROSÉ & SKIN-CONTACT

chateau simone

Nestled in the forested hills just south of Aix-en-Provence, Château Simone encompasses twenty hectares of vineyards on limestone soils in a tiny appellation called Palette, which is virtually a monopoly of the domaine. The north-facing slopes and forests that surround the vineyard create a cool microclimate that makes for wines of great freshness and ageability.

The white is predominantly Clairette, with small amounts of Grenache Blanc and Ugni Blanc, and a dash of Bourboulenc, Muscat Blanc, Picpoul, Furmint and Sémillon. The white is aged one year in 20–30 hl casks then one year in older barrels. The red and rosé from Simone are primarily composed of Grenache and Mourvèdre with a mélange other grape varieties in small proportion including Cinsault, Syrah, Carignan, Cabernet Sauvignon, Castet, Manosquin, Théoulier, Tibouren, Picpoul Noir and Muscat de Hambourg. The rosé is powerful and delicious, unique in its category and well worth your time.

maison stephan & jean michel stephan

Jean Michel was born into a family of apricot farmers at a time when the steep vineyards of Cote Rotie were so devalued that his family was gifted a parcel within the appellation with the purchase of a plot of fertile farmland along the Rhone River. Though the family grew a small amount of grapes that they sold off in bulk, Jean Michel was the first to take a real interest in wine, planting his first vineyard in 1986 and making his own wine starting in 1994. From the beginning, Jean Michel was drawn to organic farming and natural winemaking. Along with friends like Marcel Lapierre and Philippe & Michèle Aubéry of Domaine Gramenon, Jean Michel was an early pioneer of what is now popularly known as natural winemaking. Now working with his son Romain, he remains one of the best to work in this style, crafting wines that are consistently profound without the use of sulfur.
