Presenting my Internship - Friday, June 11 2026

After your internship experience, you will be asked to present on what you did and what you learned. You will have **10 minutes** to present your internship and answer questions.

Ten minutes goes by fast - you cannot recount everything you experienced. So choose carefully the details of your presentation based on what the audience would need and like to hear. Practice your presentation ahead of time, keeping track of time so that you get the feel for your time usage.

Internship for 10th graders – June 1-5 2026

**Explanatory note from the FASNY
for the attention of potential host companies**

In order to give students an introductory experience of life in the workplace, FASNY is setting up work experience periods in various work situations for its 10th Graders.

This internship forms part of a careers education program.

This is **not** a professional training period involving real work tasks. Our pupils do not have the necessary skills.

It is, then, an opportunity for **observation**, a one week ‘visit’ during which the employer may nonetheless give students age-appropriate tasks within their scope.

Although the students remain pupils of the FASNY throughout this period, they must respect the house-rules of the host company (health and safety, conscientiousness, punctuality, discipline, working hours).

The designated dates are: **Monday June 1st - Friday June 5th 2026**

Financial implications for the employer: None (no salary, no allowances, no compensation for meals or transport costs).

There will be an introductory session at school before the work experience starts, and a debriefing period afterwards.

The work placement areas are chosen by the student (and his/her parents) in keeping with the student’s particular interests and planned career.

The student will have a “school-tutor” who will liaise with the host company and act as contact should any problems arise.

The host company will undertake to provide the student with a “company-tutor”, a referee responsible for organising the work experience, giving the student various aspects of work to observe or study (charts, different activities within the company), any appropriate tasks, inviting the student to take part in a meeting or a visit, etc.

A placement agreement will be drawn up and signed by representatives of the host company and FASNY, the student and their parents.
