

## **PHRASAL VERBS**

### EAT UP / DRINK UP

When you

When you eat up your meal, you will get a dessert.

I want to try apple juice after I drink up this lemonade.

fill up - fill something completely (fill up the tank in the car)

come / run / drive up to - approach, come closer

come up with - make some ideas, plan

Let's come up with a topic for discussion.

set up - arrange, organize

set up alarm, set up a tent, set up the time

### SEPARABLE PHRASAL VERB

#### PUT ON

put a shirt on, put on a shirt -> same when you put the object between the verb and preposition or after preposition.

BUT: use pronoun always between verb and preposition

put IT on ~~put on it~~

### INSEPARABLE PHRASAL VERB

get away from this boring person/place

I want to have some changes and I'd like to get away from this city for a while.

## **DIRECT - REPORTED SPEECH**

eat - ate

will eat - would eat

can help - could help

is playing - was playing

have been - had been PRESENT PERFECT -> PAST PERFECT

may - might

should - should

were knitting - had been knitting

kept - had kept

**must** do - present = **have to** do -> **had to** do

had done - had done PAST PERFECT doesn't change in Reported Speech

has been sleeping - had been sleeping

am - was

was/were - had been
