Gotten appropriate log in credentials for the listening section of the test (see building administrator)

	Scheduled for more desks to be delivered (if needed) with custodian services? (if appropriate in your building)
	Removed or covered any educational content from the walls
	Celebrated yourself for all you have organized and accomplished?
Have	e you? (Day Before OR Same Day To Do List):
	Reminded administrators of the NYSESLAT exam occurring and asked that they not run fire drills during that time?
	Reminded classroom teachers of the NYSESLAT exam times and how/when students will be pulled (if it will be individually or groups – which students (not commanding))
	Removed or covered any educational content from the walls?
	Tested how you will administer the listening component (prerecorded in grades 3-12)?
	Sharpened extra pencils?
	Put up "offices" (or other visual dividers), if needed?
	Reminded yourself to have patience? (This is overwhelming to classroom teachers so they might make mistakes and/or forget to send students! This is overwhelming to you because there are so many moving pieces! Everyone deserves grace.)
