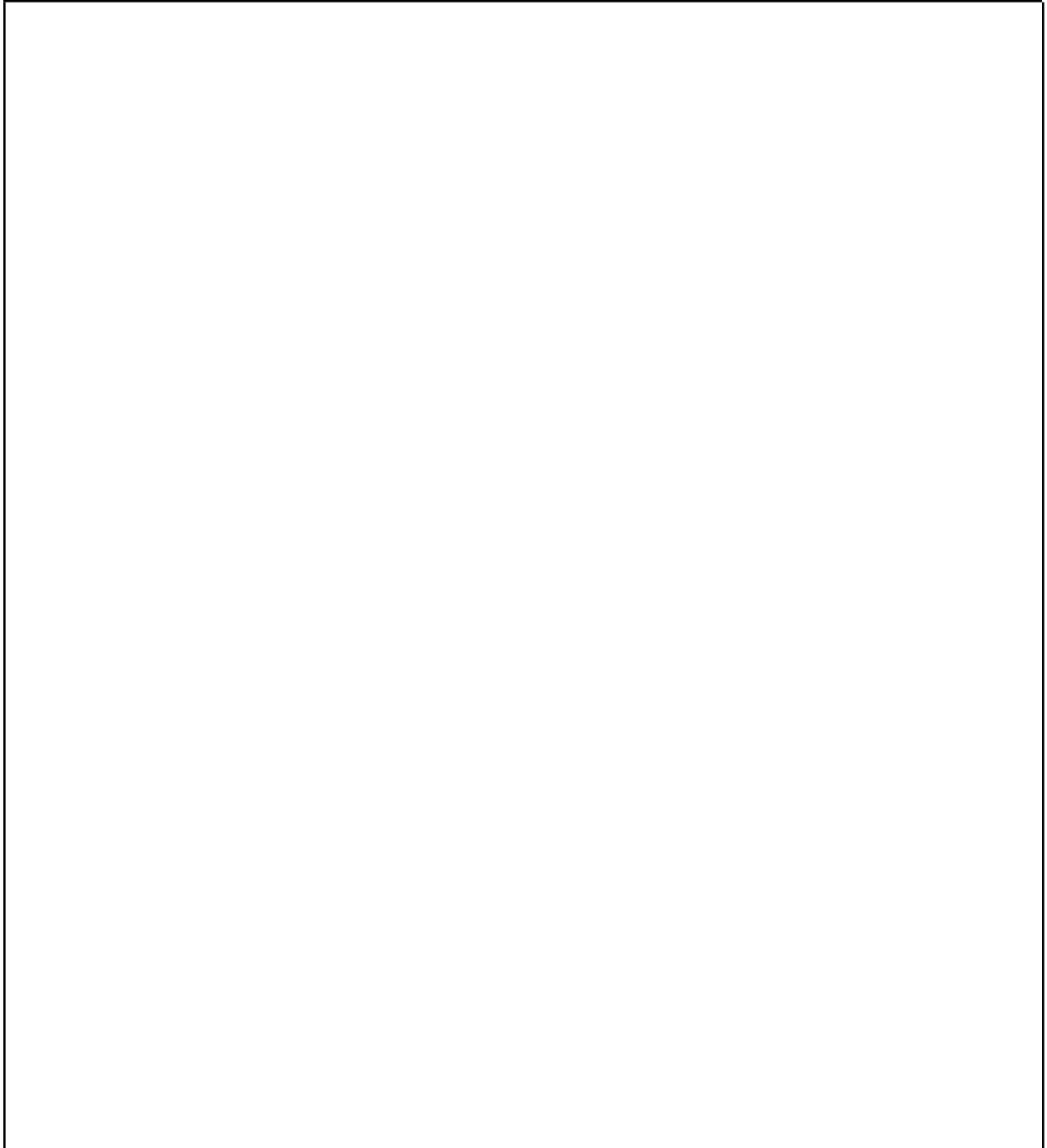

(Hint: The top of the drawing will be the darkest.)

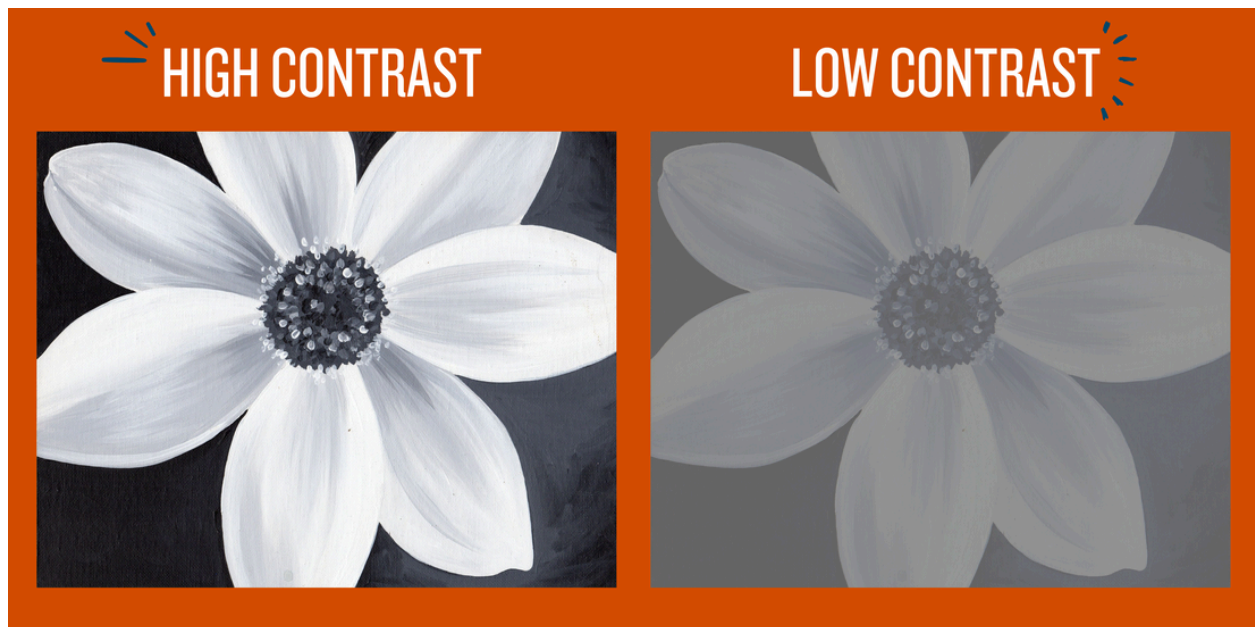

The different arrows on the artwork below point to some different values in TC Canon's piece.

You can see the sky changing grey over the different places in the windows. The mountain farthest in the back is darker than the closer one. The character's face in front is darker than the shirt and hat they are wearing. Even the shoes are slightly darker than the floor and window frames. All these differences in value make the piece interesting instead of staying flat.
