

Master in Women's Studies - Minor in Faith-Based Gender Equality and Empowerment

HBI University

Course Duration: 2 years

Credit Hours: 69 (including 15 credit hours for minor)



Program Description

The Master in Women's Studies at HBI University is designed to provide students with a comprehensive understanding of gender issues, feminist theory, social justice advocacy, and policy-making. This program integrates historical, sociological, and political perspectives to prepare graduates for careers in gender advocacy, nonprofit leadership, education, and public policy.

The Minor in Faith-Based Gender Equality and Empowerment offers a specialized focus on the intersection of faith, gender equity, and empowerment within religious communities. Students will explore biblical perspectives on gender justice, faith-based advocacy for women's rights, and the role of women in leadership within religious and secular institutions.

This 69-credit hour program includes 30 credit hours of foundational women's studies courses, 24 credit hours of core advocacy and policy training, 15 credit hours in Faith-Based Gender Equality and Empowerment, elective coursework, a supervised practicum, and a research-based master's thesis or capstone project.

Admissions Requirements

- Bachelor's degree in women's studies, sociology, political science, theology, or a related field
- Minimum GPA of 3.0
- Two letters of recommendation from faculty or gender advocacy professionals
- Statement of purpose outlining career goals in gender studies and faith-based empowerment
- Writing sample (research on gender studies, advocacy work, or faith-based initiatives)
- Interview with faculty committee (if required)

Practicum Requirement

Students must complete a 300-hour supervised practicum in women's advocacy organizations, faith-based nonprofits, social justice initiatives, or government agencies focused on gender equality. Practicum placements include Christian women's leadership programs, interfaith gender justice initiatives, and nonprofit organizations that empower women through faith-based advocacy.

Master's Thesis / Capstone Project

Students are required to complete either a research-based master's thesis on faith-based gender justice, women's leadership in religious institutions, or biblical perspectives on equality or develop a capstone project implementing a faith-based empowerment initiative for women.

Program Outcomes

Graduates of this program will be able to:

- Analyze historical and contemporary gender issues through a faith-based lens.
- Advocate for gender justice and equality within faith communities and secular organizations.
- Develop and implement faith-based programs for women's empowerment.
- Influence public policy on gender rights through faith-driven advocacy.
- Examine the role of religious institutions in shaping gender norms and policies.

- Women's Rights Advocate - \$55,000 - \$120,000
- Faith-Based Nonprofit Director - \$65,000 - \$135,000
