## How to plan your Impromptu Speech

- 1. What is my thesis/theme?
  - The Thesis is whatever you want your audience to believe
  - The Theme is the underlying principle that explains why your audience should believe it.
- 2. What's my last sentence?
  - Plan your last sentence and kicker before you start talking! This is the
    organizing principle of our whole talk. As you are speaking you should
    have that sentence in mind, and work your way to that kicker. If you plan
    nothing else, know how you will land the plane!
- 3. Who is my audience?
  - Imagine your audience and what will engage them. Think about what you know about people, and how to engage them. Then, as you are talking, try to calibrate your message to their interests, adapting as you go to engage people who seem to be drifting.
- 4. What is my goal?
  - o Inform
  - Sell
  - Persuade
  - Perform
  - Entertain
  - Build trust + friendship
  - Self- Expression/Art
  - Obfuscate
  - Problematize
  - Threaten

- Challenge
- Inspire
- Warn/Discourage
- Engage
- Synthesize

- 5. What's my content plan?
  - Once you are clear on your thesis/theme, last sentence, audience, and goal, ONLY THEN should you consider content (if you have time). The content can follow organically if you have 1-4 figured out.
- 6. What's my presentation plan?
  - Even if you don't have time to make a plan, you must signal that you have made a plan. Use signposting and clear language at the beginning and end, even if the middle of your speech was a total mess.
- 7. How can I use my physical environment (Notecard? Board? Props?)
  - If you are allowed to use a notecard, make sure you don't use it too much.
     Ideally you will speak without notes. But if you don't think you can stay organized without notes, use the notecard!
