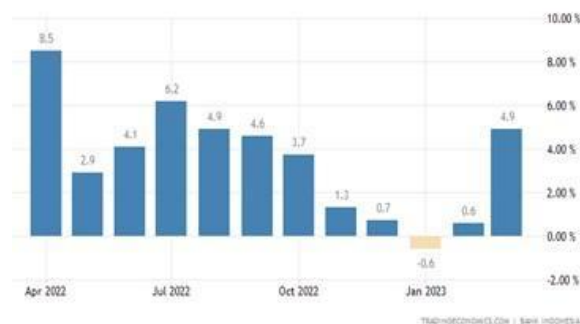


Figure 1. Indonesia retail sales (YoY)
