Describing a Political Cartoon to an Imaginary Visually-Impaired Friend

For this assignment you will pretend that you wish to share your views on a political cartoon that you have recently read with a friend who is visually impaired. Your friend has software that will read text aloud, but cannot see the actual cartoon.

- 1. Write a meaningful subject line to clarify the topic of your message. Think of the subject line as the title of paper. Provide the narrowed subject and your viewpoint: A Funny Political Cartoon Criticizing Taxes.
- 2. Open your e-mail with a noun of direct address (You will need to create a name for your imaginary visually-impaired friend.) or a greeting (salutation):

Eduardo,

Dear Emily,

- 3. Create context for your reader (your imaginary visually-impaired friend). Tell him/her the name of the cartoonist, the date of publication, and the name of the newspaper where you found it.
- 4. Express your viewpoint.
- 5. Describe the political cartoon in a manner that your friend can experience it. Use specific names, details, and at least two comparisons.
- 6. Explain your viewpoint about the cartoon.
- 8. Invite response from your friend.
- 9. End with your name.

Use standard spelling, punctuation, capitalization and grammar. Do not use slang. For a slightly more informal tone, you may use contractions.
