

## “Farrington Family Feud”

### SEL Competency

1. **Sense of Belonging:** How well students feel they are valued members of the school community.
2. **Self Management:** How well students manage their emotions, thoughts, and behaviors in different situations.
3. **Social Awareness:** How well students consider the perspectives of others and empathize with them.

### Objective

To review information and context about our school and community in a fun and engaging way to build students' knowledge and social skills.

### Review

### Instructions:

#### 1. Opener (choices):

- a. Here is a short description of your role as an advisor:

*Every student has an advisor who guides their progress throughout their time at Farrington. A meaningful advisor-advisee relationship can be a critical factor in a student's success and resilience. Your first priority as an advisory teacher is to build a relationship with your advisees. There will be a weekly curriculum sent out for advisory, but please adapt it to the needs of your students. Advisors may also substitute more relevant topics during advisory unless it is a mandatory Personal Transition Plan (PTP) requirement. Frequently there will be more materials that can be used during the allotted times. Unless it is a PTP requirement, please pick and choose what would be most helpful to your students.*

- b. Purpose of Advisory - (Please read to students):

*“The purpose of Advisory is to help you build a sense of belonging and relationships with your peers in a smaller classroom community. Advisory takes place most Fridays for 30 minutes with the same group throughout your entire time at Farrington. As your advisor, I play many different roles: teacher, coach, motivator, guide, advocate, adult friend, mentor and role model. Every student has an advisor who guides their progress throughout their time at Farrington. During Advisory we will go over lessons and activities that will focus on your academic and social-emotional learning in hopes that you will build skills to help you find success during your time here and into the real world.”*

## 2. Lesson: Farrington “Family Feud” \*New questions added

Equipment needed: List of questions (see below); bell. If you don’t have a bell use an item big enough for students to see & grab.

1. Split the Advisees into two teams, lined up on either side of a neutral table with the bell on it.
2. Explain: *“This is like Family Feud, except it’s Farrington-style, so questions will have to do with FHS, as well as the larger community. Also, the scoring system is slightly different.”*
3. Continue: *“The first two people on each team will come up and put their hands behind their back. I will read a question, and the first person to ring the bell/ grab the item on the table” wins the round*
4. Continue: *“The controlling team can then decide to ‘play’ or ‘pass’. If they play, the next person on that team will answer the next question. If correct, the team can play on -- for double points, or no points if they’re wrong -- or ‘bank’ the point they already earned.”*
5. Continue: *“If the team plays on and misses the question, the other team can ‘steal’ the points in play, by answering the same question correctly.”*
6. Continue: *“We’ll keep track of the score on the board. Note that it is fairly easy to accumulate a lot of points, as long as you know the answers.”*
7. Use the questions below, randomly picking them, and play the game, moving the energy along as quickly as possible.
8. **Debrief** with questions such as, *“Which questions were the hardest to answer? Why is it important to know the answers to these questions? What does it mean to belong to a family? school? community?”*
