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Common Q&A: For anyone considering and/or in treatment*

Should I call my fertility clinic?

- If you live in Alabama, it is important for you to stay connected to your fertility clinic as the situation evolves. If you are in an active treatment cycle, do not hesitate to check in with your provider as some modifications in your treatment plan may need to be considered.
- If you're not in Alabama, it is a personal decision as to whether you want to reach out to your doctor/clinic. Your doctor(s) are likely working behind the scenes to try and advocate for no additional rulings like the one seen in Alabama. It's likely that your doctors and/or clinic may be fielding a lot of questions and they'll reach out to you to share an update if they foresee that you will be affected in any way. You're of course always free to reach out to your clinic and/or other medical providers for an update as well.

If I do call my fertility clinic, what should I ask?

- If you do call your doctor and/or clinic, some potential questions could include:
 - o Does this Alabama ruling change anything about my treatment plan?
 - Do you anticipate making any changes to the treatment(s) you will offer given this ruling?
 - Where are my eggs and/or embryos stored currently? (if applicable)
 - Do you recommend I consider making any changes related to their storage?
 - Do you use an out-of-state lab for embryo genetic testing? If so, where?
 Do you foresee any changes to your approach?
 - What's the best way for me to stay updated about any changes in my care or your clinics' protocols related to this ruling? (Like your website or patient portal)

What else should I be concerned about?

- Right now, the main impact of this ruling is being felt in Alabama. However, the
 fallout has the potential to reach far beyond state borders. It's important to
 stay informed of the current political environment in your community. <u>Find out</u>
 who your representatives are—their websites often outline the bills they
 support and their stances on important issues.
- We're all hopeful that our government takes action to address this ruling and prevent others from following suit. The Access to Family Building Act,



- sponsored by Senators Tammy Duckworth and Pat Murray and US Representative Susan Wild, is a national bill on the table that would solidify protection for IVF. See below to voice your support for this bill.
- That said, we recognize that this is making an already stressful experience
 even more stressful, so we are happy to talk with you about your concerns,
 fears and/or potential considerations. See above and reach out to

- We've also shared other resources to consider, including group sessions to talk with others in a similar situation, coaching via Frame, mental health options, and/or legal resources.
