## **Section 13 – About God's Church**

### **Lesson 82- A Time of Remembrance (The Lord's Supper)**

**Start with a prayer**

**Memory Verse – Luke 22:19 – And he took bread, gave thanks and broke it, and gave it to them, saying "This is my body given for you; do this in remembrance of me."**

**Our lesson Scripture for lesson 82 – part 1 – Luke 22:19**

**Read: Luke 22:19**

**Comment:** The Lord's Supper – we are going to look at the remembrance, a time of refreshing and communion with God and our part in the Lord's Supper. What an awesome thought to be commanded to dine at the Lord's Table – "Do this in remembrance of me." We bring to mind that He did do these things for us. The remembrance started in the upper room with Jesus and the disciples, but its roots are also back in Egypt –

**Read: Exodus 12:21-28 and answer these questions:**

1. What were the elders to tell the people?
2. What are they to tell their children?
3. What three things did the Israelites do?

**Something to talk about:**

What were the Israelites delivered from? What are we delivered from through the death of Christ? What did Jesus tell the disciples to do Luke 22:19?

**Next time we will talk about nourishment received from the Lord's Supper.**

**Family Prayer Requests:**

**Pray:** Dear Heavenly Father, thank-you for sharing with your disciples the first communion and the remembrance continues centuries later for we cannot forget what you did for us on Calvary. In Jesus' Name we pray. Amen.

### **Lesson 82– The Benefits (The Lord's Supper)**

**Start with a prayer**

**Review Memory Verse – Luke 22:19**

**Our lesson Scripture for lesson 82 – Part 2 – Luke 24:30**

**Read: Luke 24:30**

**Comment:** Remembering what Christ did for us by dying and rising again benefits us. We bring to mind forgiveness, eternal life and the gift of the Holy Spirit. Just as God taught prayer and reading of the Word as ways of communicating His love and grace to us – He also gave us this remembrance to nourish our faith and bring us closer to Him and to each other.

**Read: Romans 5:6-11 and answer these questions:**

1. What were we before Christ died for us?
2. What kept Christ on the cross? (Not the nails)
3. What are we saved through?

**Something to talk about:** How is Romans 5:6-11 a good Communion Meditation? Does it help you to “do this in remembrance of me”?

**Next Time we are going to talk about our part in the Lord's Supper**

**Family Prayer Requests:**

**Pray:** Dear God, thank-you for instituting the Lord's Supper, for we so easily forget what is done for us and we must not forget your sacrifice for us and empowering us by the Holy Spirit each and every day! In the power of the Holy Spirit and in Jesus' Name we pray. Amen.

### **Lesson 82- Our Part (The Lord's Supper)**

**Review Memory Verse – Luke 22:19**

**Our lesson Scripture for lesson 82– part 3 – Psalm 139:23-24**

**Read: Psalm 139:23-24 (If possible read all of Psalm 139)**

**Comment:** We have looked at the Lord's Supper as a time of remembrance, the benefits of being justified by and reconciled to Christ – we each have a part too – besides getting ourselves to the Sunday service to partake of the Lord's Supper – we are to examine ourselves and be as prepared to dine at the Lord's Table!

**Read: I Corinthians 11:27-34 and answer these questions:**

1. What is the first thing we should do?
2. What are we to recognize?
3. What does the Lord do when he judges us? Why?

**Something to talk about:** What are some things that we may do that God would not approve of at Communion time? (Read I Corinthians 11:17-23 to see what the Corinthians were guilty of). What should be in our prayer in the moments before the Lord's Supper is served?

**Next time we will talk about inviting others to worship God**

**Family Prayer Requests:**

**Pray:** Dear Heavenly Father, we sometimes minimize the magnitude of your love, sacrifice and how you care for us. Help us to always recognize your broken body and shed blood as we approach the table you have prepared for us. In the power of the Holy Spirit and in Jesus' Name we pray. Amen.
