	Feeding malnourished children in Nakivale refugee camp
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Project title	
Duration	Three months, either from the reception of funds.
Project context	Declining aid in Uganda: malnutrition rises in refugee camps Fleeing nearly 30 years of violence in the east of the DRC, many Congolese are taking the road to exile, particularly in neighboring Uganda, which welcomes refugees. Every week, more Congolese arrive at Nakivale, one of the country's largest and oldest camps. But while humanitarian organizations are on the ground to help, budgets are hard to come by. Food aid has been cut back, impacting nutrition and resulting in widespread malnutrition among the children of Congolese refugees newly settled in the Nakivale camp, and more specifically in the village of Kashojwa B. Faced with this shortage of aid, some major humanitarian players have even had to make radical decisions and change their approach to providing assistance. Such is the case of the UN's World Food Program (WFP). In 2023, according to figures provided by actors in the field, only 35% of humanitarian needs for refugees in Uganda had been financed: in these conditions, it would be impossible to maintain the full amount of food aid for all the people concerned, i.e. 1.6 million people in the country. The WFP has therefore changed its approach to prioritizing this assistance. All refugees no longer have access to this assistance, but have been divided into three categories. The first must be able to support themselves: these are generally refugees who have been living in Uganda for a long time, who have set up businesses or started farming. The second group continues to receive some aid, but it is reduced. In principle, however, full assistance has been maintained for the most vulnerable: single women, disabled people and new arrivals. But this is only in principle, as the funds available do not currently allow it: they receive 60% of the sum initially planned, i.e. around 6 dollars per month per person. To this end, MWANGA ORGANIZATION's program to feed malnourished children will be one way of meeting the need for food, and thus alleviating some of the children's suffering.
Project objectives	a) Global objective

	▪ Reduce the rate of malnutrition in the Nakivale camp in Uganda. b) Specific objectives : ● Improve the health status of children in the medical care camp for vulnerable refugees living with disabilities in the Nakivale camp in Uganda; ● Provide descent feeding to malnourished children in Nakivale, Uganda.
Target group	Orphaned children, children with albinism and children with disabilities aged between 5 and 12 years old.
Area of intervention	Nakivale Refugee Settlement Camp
Expect results	- 150 orphans, children with albinism and children with disabilities aged between 5 and 12 are well-nourished and healthy; - The rate of malnutrition is reduced and children are regularly fed;
