



Fire Prevention

The Fire Prevention Officer is responsible to ensure all life safety systems for new construction and renovations are designed and installed properly. This requires pre-construction meetings, plan review, code research and continual site visits to ensure proper installation. In 2013 the Department issued 829 permits and monitored several building renovations. Major projects include: Pulte Homes, Planet Fitness, Portland Pie, M.F. Charles Building and Johnson Woods.

For existing buildings, the Fire Prevention Officer is responsible to ensure all life safety systems are maintained properly. Other areas of responsibility include ensuring the safety and code compliance of flammable and combustible product storage.
