If there is more than one work by the same first author, their papers are listed following the indication of Journal of Micropalaeontology: (1) single author papers (first author), followed by (2) co-author papers (first author and second author), and finally (3) team papers (first author et al.). You can find more information on how to list the reference papers here: https://www.journal-of-micropalaeontology.net/submission.html#references. You can include only one figure or chart. The deadline for abstract submission is September, 7th 2025. The abstracts be submitted through the online form must (https://tms25pisa.dst.unipi.it/registration-abstract-submission.html) as a word file. The Scientific Committee will inform the authors of any required corrections to the abstract, or of any changes in presentation format (from oral to poster, or vice versa), after the 30th of September. Oral presentations will have a duration of 15 minutes including questions (30 mins including questions for keynotes), please estimate an average of 12 minutes for your presentation (presentations should be landscape only, 1920 x 1080 pixels or 16:9).

Poster presentations: the printed poster must be 1 page-portrait orientation only (A0, 84.1 cm × 118.9 cm). If in the registration form you asked us to print your poster, please, send us a pdf file of your poster by October, 31st (be sure to send us a file with the proper resolution for printing). Prepare a 1 slide presentation if you want to give a 3-minutes flash-talk (landscape only, 1920 x 1080 pixels or 16:9) to introduce your poster.
