Children will be supervised by myself and some support staff to allow for teachers to be able to conduct their interviews from 1pm.

Government Education Priorities for 2025:

In 2025, the New Zealand Government is focusing on key areas to improve education:

- Section Clearer Curriculum A knowledge-based curriculum that guides teachers and helps students succeed.
- Numeracy Evidence-based teaching to strengthen skills in reading, writing, and math.
- Assessment & Reporting Clear ways to track student progress for better accountability.
- Attendance From Term 1, 2025, schools must report daily attendance using new codes, highlighting the importance of being at school every day.

These changes will take time, and we are committed to implementing them properly. At our school, it's business as usual with amazing teachers providing excellent learning in reading, writing, maths and all other curriculum areas. We're also updating our systems to align with these changes, including using the HERO attendance software, adding new math resources like Oxford Maths and Numicon, and offering professional development for our teachers. Why Attendance Matters

Regular attendance is key to success in learning. Did you know?

- If a child misses one day per week, that adds up to 40 days per year—which is 8 weeks of school lost!
- If a child is late by one hour per week, that equals 40 hours per year—which is one whole week of learning missed!

Every day and every hour at school makes a big difference. Let's work together to support regular attendance and ensure the best outcomes for our children.

PB4L ~ At Waikaka School, we're focusing on Positive Behaviour for Learning (PB4L) to help our students grow into kind, respectful, and responsible individuals. To encourage positive behaviour, we give out tokens when children show our school values, cooperation, collaboration, and competition. When students collect enough tokens, the whole school gets to enjoy a special reward. We are currently taking a poll for the reward with suggestions by the children like pyjama day, sports day, or a pizza party. It's all about celebrating the good things our students do, from helping others to respecting each other and looking after our school environment. Together, we're building a positive and supportive school community!



- Subscribe to the groups that are relevant to you, then click the 'go back' button on your phone, which will bring you to the main screen of your schools app.






