September Topic: Opportunities for Community Outreach and Engagement Two thirds of NH energy committees report they are already engaged in community outreach efforts and are interested in doing more. Guest Speaker: Sofia Reali and Jessica Williams from Window Dressers, a Maine-based organization that coordinates volunteer-led "builds" across Maine, Vermont, and New Hampshire. Teams sign up their neighbors to receive custom-built window inserts, receive custom cut pieces ready to assemble, and host community build days to put the inserts together. The inserts are priced to generate enough revenue to cover the cost of a portion of window inserts for lower income neighbors.

Normally you hear the pitch that a storm window (single extra pane) can increase the u-value (1/R-value) from around 1 for an average single pane window, down to 0.5. This is huge, but a double pane window with argon inside can have u-values averaging 0.25.

Consider that Window Dressers inserts are double paned, that's then closer to a u-value of 0.3! That's basically the insulation value of a brand new (off brand) double pane window. Of course inserts are not as durable and the view is slightly obstructed, but that's a huge energy win for an extremely affordable price.

We really need to drive this point within our communities. I'd love to see a publicly available calculator that can take a few inputs (total sqft of windows, type of existing windows) and output energy saved, then converted to money depending on heating source
