2	<u>Dimsum</u> <u>Auntie Cat</u>	Personable. Just wants you to be well fed. A lil' catty.
3	Qu Yuan	Dead poet who rises from the river. Speaks in translation a la HK movie English subtitles. A little sassy, seemingly vague but actually to the point. Died for what he believed in. Has seen some shit.
4	Gramma Shrimp	Grandmother of Little Shrimp.
5	Big Headed Shrimp	The groundsweeper of Sandbar Cemetery.
6	<u>Jean Claude</u> <u>Van Dam</u>	Beaver. Passionate. Righteous. Will do anything to protect his family.
7	Tiger Mom	Annoying status obsessed auntie. Spoils her little prince TERRY, her only child.
8	Cousin Mantis Shrimp	17 years old. Very sea smart.
9	Tuna Turner	Karaoke Auntie Star. Grand. Mystical. Charismatic. Also a moon goddess.
10	<u>Devon</u>	(they/them) Captain of the Passion Dragons. Extroverted, but emotionally avoidant, and would prefer to make corny jokes instead. Faye's best friend.
11	Little Shrimp	10 years old. Hero.
12	Bunnifer	(7yo) twin girl (protagonist) Takes after her mom, action oriented. Spontaneous, thinks on the spot. Extroverted. Older than BUNNITHY by 68 seconds.
13	<u>Faye</u>	(they/them) Drummer of the Passion Dragons dragon boat team. Introverted. Comes from a long line of dragon boat drummers, but loves rock drumming. Has difficulty speaking up for themselves and would rather others make decisions for them.
14	RoRo	Cautious. An observer, and notices things that others don't because of their quiet nature. Nervous/cautious side and often needs encouragement from their friends.
