Rotation:

The rotation is an inpatient and outpatient experience tapping into diverse patient encounters, at the CHLA, Sunset Location: 4650 Sunset Boulevard, Los Angeles, CA 90027

Where to Go on Your First Day:

Alvin Manuel will email a *welcome packet* which will include information about Parking, Badge, IT access as well as your schedule 1 week before the first morning of rotation to confirm inpatient and outpatient schedule. The inpatient Rheumatology team consists of a Rheumatology Attending and typically a Pediatric Rheumatology fellow as well as a fluctuating number of rotating trainees. As a primary service, the rheumatology inpatient team rounds with Team 5 CHLA resident team. The Clinic is located on the 2nd floor McClister Building; Please email her if you have not yet received your schedule.

Typical Weekly Schedule:

Residents on this rotation will be attending several rheumatology clinics, inpatient rounds on established rheumatology patients as well as established pediatric rheumatology patients and inpatient consults weekly. If possible, each resident will also observe patients in Multidisciplinary Clinics. The Rheumatology Clinic occurs from 8am- 4:30pm in person Tuesday- Friday. The inpatient team is available to see patients from 8am-5pm with pre-rounding on patients occurring prior to Team 5 resident rounds which occur after 9am (check for exact timing with Attending). Inpatients are reviewed at the division conference on Tuesday Mornings on Teams Meeting starting at 8:45am. Clinic patients are reviewed by the Division on Monday afternoons starting at 2pm with a CCS (California Children's Services) meeting and subsequent discussion about interesting Clinic patients.

Resident Roles and Responsibilities

1. Attend Rheumatology clinics
2. See outpatients, present to attendings, and complete EMR documentation
3. Attend Rheumatology conferences
4. Review Goals & Objective of Pediatric Rheumatology Rotation as well as Online Resources
5. Search for clinically relevant information for more evidence-based encounters
6. Present a Case to the Division

Evaluation and Feedback

Informal feedback will be provided throughout the rotation by attendings as the resident works with them. The resident's evaluation in Medhub will be a group composite evaluation from all the attendings the resident has worked with during the rotation and will be based upon the core competencies.
