Selection Criteria Philosophies

The selection criteria has been designed to balance a number of different factors. The stated goals of the season and the program over multiple seasons must be in balance with the need to provide opportunities for athletes to gain experience.

In general:

- Performance criteria (based on final ranking at competitions, or gained international points) should select athletes first, should be standards, and should be easy to understand.
- Evaluation criteria (based on a review of in-and-out-of-the-ring characteristics of an athlete) should select the athlete if performance criteria haven't been met or if they aren't available. These criteria should be informed by assessment tools that are publicly available whenever possible.
- If both Performance and Evaluation criteria are not able to select an athlete, then the expert judgement of the High Performance Director should be used given that the HPD is responsible for the overall program, not any particular athlete(s) within the program.

Specifics:

- Performance criteria must take into account the relative field strength of a competition. An example of this is Sport Canada's standard of Top 8 at World Championships or Olympics is not absolute - it also requires that the result be in the top-half of the field of competitors.
- Given boxing's sometimes small field sizes, Boxing Canada believes that an athlete must have at least one win for a performance criteria to be valid.
- The classification system of competitions (Class A, B, C) is deliberately left a little vague to be as encompassing as possible. However there could be Class B and C competitions where the strength of a particular field is unusually weak. While this is obviously not the fault of our athletes, it could make for a situation where our results appear greater than we could have normally expected. This is where the validation of a field comes into play. The validation of a field can only be conducted after a competition is complete which could create a situation where a Canadian athlete believes they have achieved a criteria but post-event it is decided their performance is not sufficient to meet a particular standard. Hopefully such situations are rare, and in case they exist the onus of Boxing

Canada is to provide evidence on why a field was insufficiently strong, rather than for an athlete to prove that a field was sufficiently strong.

- Tie-breaking results: International results may or may not clarify rankings sufficiently for Boxing Canada’s needs. In cases where the published results do not break ties the following formula will be used:

When not explicitly noted in the posted results of competitions listed in the following eight carding prioritization tables, Boxing Canada will utilize the following method to determine the Top-4, Top-6 and Top-8 competitive results of athletes plus the final placement of each athlete within the division.

In large divisions within single-elimination competitions, multiple athletes can achieve division rankings of 9th, 17th, 33rd and 65th. If breaking a tie by comparing two or more athletes’ final placements at a designated competition is necessary, Boxing Canada will apply the method detailed in the above table to rank athletes beyond 8th place. If the competition software used to manage the designated competition provides a relative ranking within each broader ranking category of 9th, 17th, 33rd and 65th, then the software’s relative ranking will be utilized to compare athletes within a tie-breaking process.

- All evaluation criteria and HPD judgement must take into account the competitive readiness of the athlete. To have the best information available to determine competitive readiness athletes should have up to date training logs, Individual Performance Plans, and Yearly Training Plans shared with the national team staff.

Eligibility Requirements

To be eligible for selection to any Boxing Canada targeted event, athletes must:

- Be competitive members of Boxing Canada and in good standing with their PTSO and NSO
- Meet the age requirements for the targeted event
- Have no outstanding invoices with Boxing Canada unless authorized in advance
- Have completed an [Athlete Agreement](#) and UCCMS declaration at [SportConsent.ca](#)
- Complete all relevant anti-doping requirements
- Hold Canadian citizenship and a valid Canadian passport

Decision-Making Authority

The High Performance Director (HPD) is responsible for developing and implementing the selection criteria. Team nominations made by the HPD, in consultation with the High Performance staff, will be ratified by Boxing Canada's Executive Director to ensure fairness and adherence to the outlined process. In cases where the HPD and ED roles are held by the same person, team selection decisions will be ratified by an Ad Hoc committee of the Board of Directors.

Appeals

Appeals regarding team nominations will follow [Boxing Canada's Appeal Policy](#).

Removal from the Team

Athletes may be disqualified from events for:

- Breaching their [Athlete Agreement](#)
- Failing to meet eligibility requirements
- Violating [anti-doping policies](#)
- Violation of the [Code of Conduct and Ethics](#), [Safe Sport Policies](#) or the [UCCMS](#)

Funding

Funding for targeted events will depend on Boxing Canada's budget allocations. Specific details will be provided as early as possible.

Coaching Opportunities

Coach Intern positions: Coach interns will be selected from a list of coaches currently in the coach intern system. Should these positions not be filled for a particular camp or competition they will not be filled from individuals outside of the intern program.
