Heart Rate Practice

Goal: Become proficient at accurately measuring heart rate

Note: Heart rate is measured in beats per minute (bpm)

Materials

- A clock with a second hand or your phone
- Your pet (optional)
- Pen & Paper (optional)
- Calculator (optional)

Method 1: With A Pet

- Have your pet sit or lay down
- Palpate the femoral artery
 - Position your pointer finger and your middle finger together like finger-guns
 - Place your two fingers on the inner thigh of your pet, where the leg meets the abdomen (inner hip area)
 - Apply gentle pressure and feel around for a heartbeat
 - Sometimes it's deeper into the body, sometimes it's superficial
 - If you feel it, then congrats! You found the femoral artery!
- Using your clock or phone, count the number of heartbeats for 15 seconds
- Multiply the number you counted by 4
 - $15 \sec x 4 = 60 \sec = 1 \min$
- Record the heart rate

Method 2: Without a Pet

 Position your pointer finger and your middle finger together like finger-guns

- Find an artery
 - Place fingers in between your jaw and neck
 - Place your fingers on your wrist
 - Place your hand on your chest over your heart
- Apply gentle pressure
- Using your clock or phone, count the number of heartbeats for 15 seconds
- Multiply the number you counted by 4
 - $15 \sec x 4 = 60 \sec = 1 \min$
- Record the heart rate
