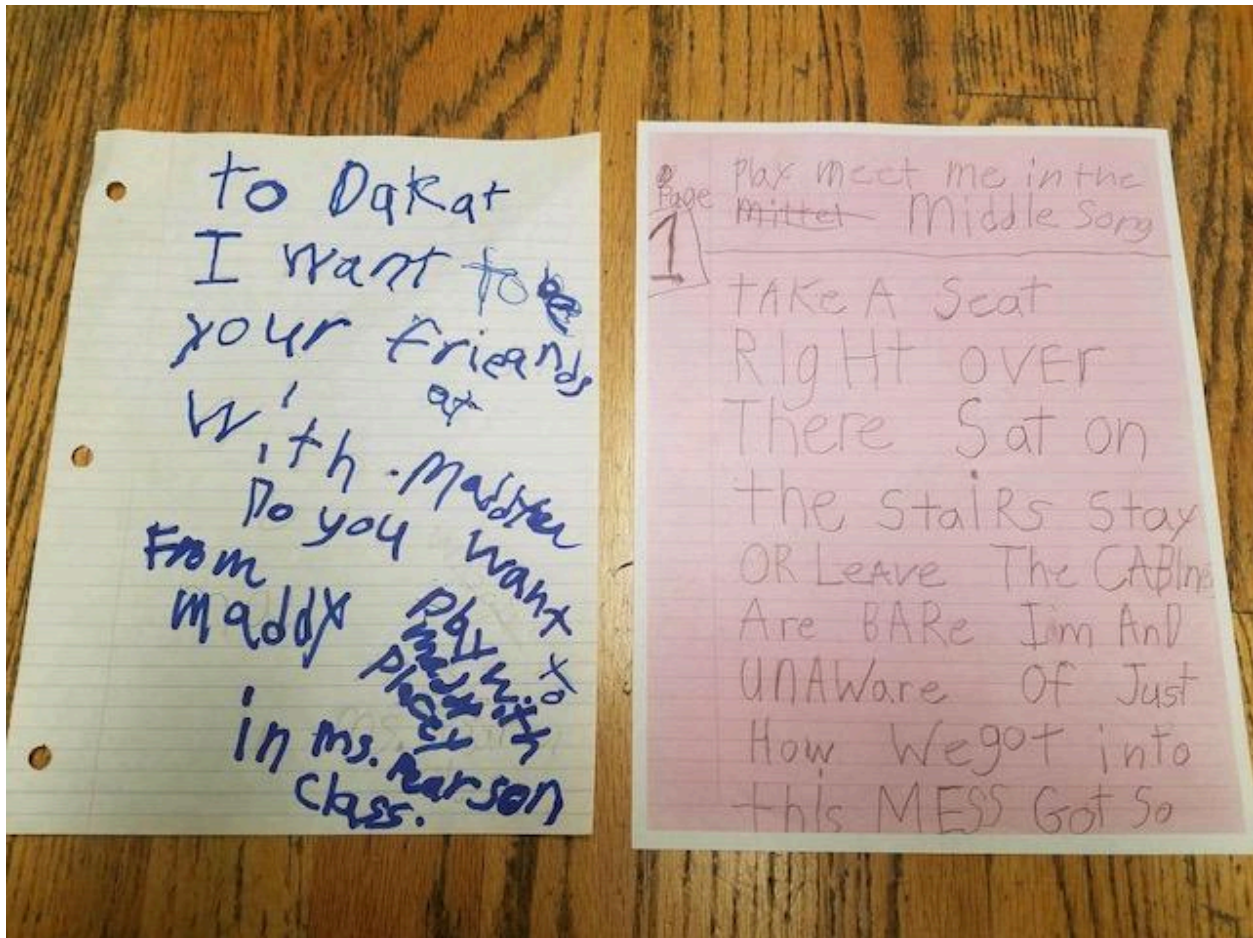


Writing Sample

White vs Pink Paper



The writing sample is that of a nine-year-old elementary student's writing. The only difference is the color of the paper. They wrote on the white paper first, then on the pink paper immediately after. This student reported that the contrast of the black text on white paper is too high contrast and too bright, they are unable to visualize the lines and their own writing, along with punctuation. Letters have incorrect size, relationships or connections. The pink paper calms down the brain's perception of brightness, letters are formed correctly and are on the lines along with a coherent message. If we can offer this accommodation to students, we are able to accurately evaluate their thinking and understanding and can remediate appropriately if necessary.
