The [Public Body] received your request under the District of Columbia Freedom of Information Act of 1976 ("D.C. FOIA"), dated [Date], on [Date] and assigned it reference number [Number]. Please cite this number in any future communications with our office regarding your request.

While the District of Columbia was formerly under a blanket government-wide suspension of D.C. FOIA deadlines due to the COVID–19 pandemic, the public health emergency ended on July 25, 2021 and, in most instances, the *pre*-pandemic time-limits once again apply. **[UNTIL OCT. 27, 2021, YOU MAY INSERT THE ITALICIZED LANGUAGE IF APPLICABLE:]** However, (1) because our public body remains closed, and (2) your request requires us to conduct an on-site review of records that could present a significant risk to health or safety, we are exercising an extension under section 202(d)(2)(D) of D.C. FOIA (D.C. Official Code § 2-532(d)(2)(D)).
