Students should respond to their pen pal email once a week. Each email is an hour of community service. During peer to peer lessons, Lexington students teach Loglogo students how to operate their computers over Google Meet from 7-8AM once a week on a day of their choosing (Monday-Friday). For lessons, the curriculum will be provided and they will have a partner helping them! All they have to do is join for an hour a week!

Project Structure: The pen pal program is completely asynchronous! Students will email their pen pal once a week, with each pen pal being officially due at Thursday, 10PM. For peer to peer lessons, we will assign a day from Monday-Friday based on your availability. From 7-8AM, students will join a Google Meet, and, along with a partner, teach Loglogo (an at-risk school in rural Kenya) students basic computer skills (such as using google docs and spreadsheets). Slideshows/curriculum will be provided! Peer to peer lessons and the pen pal program are provided year-round, but students are able to stop or start at any point.

Project Description: As a facilitator for the active bystander training, we help people at school gain confidence to stand up in more uncomfortable situations and show them that it takes just 1 person to make a difference and get others involved. As a facilitator, you run a small group with a co-facilitator through a series of activities and guidelines while helping with large group activities.

Project Structure: "IMPORTANT: the date changes each year. You have to ask Mrs.Demirev as it gets closer.

Active Bystander training happens during a school day and you go from around 8:30-2:30pm. There are transportation options like a bus from school or you can drive yourself. You will fill out a form for this. When you arrive around 8:30am, you can get breakfast, meet your facilitators and get settled. Then, facilitators being speaking at the front of the room with Mrs. Demirev and Mrs.Dyer about the day. Facilitators follow a booklet they have with activities, large group activities, and speaking point. These activites are fun, a little silly, and help people become comfortable being uncomfortable because the situations can be tough. Throughout the day, the trainees are shown various methods to intervene and

when they should get help. We talk about situations that have happened before and recognize where we could've stepped in to help. Lunch is also provided. At the end of the day, you help clean up, get on the bus (or in your car), and go home. "
