### Teacher Corner: Angela Marple - Music

- Students exploring all the different instruments STL has to offer.
- Bells have been popular - considering bringing into grade 3 as well but will definitely continue on with the new grade 4-6.
- Guitars - a great collection of guitars, not much for the littler grades.  $\frac{1}{8}$  guitar club has started (some with acoustic and some with electric. Amps are needed if we can find some being donated.
- After reviewing the assurance survey, it was noticed that Drama/theatre has been an interest in students and parents. It has been introduced slowly as its not Mrs. Marples specialty. Exploring some musical theatre aspects for next year.
- Exciting opportunities for next year as an EXTRACURRICULAR- STL has been asked to participate in the Norman Foote concert at Festival Place. He is a Canadian artist (think Fred Penner or Raffi). He does a halloween howl in October and the students have been asked to come in costume and be his backup singers for the performance to the community, alongside the  $\frac{1}{8}$  from OLPH. For STL students, it will be opened up similar to choir. You can choose to participate or not. Norman will be coming to practice at STL several times with the kids over lunch hour.
- Looking at building a music wall outside. Would like to utilize the fence along the roof that faces down into the park. Opportunity for the kids to play in a new way at recess. Recycled materials to be used. No promises for next year but Mrs. Marple will be working on it.
- Connections and chatting with Nevada Mose (music director @ABJ). Talked about ways to bring her in as a guest or bring in some of her musicians to come and chat with our students. Letting the older students know that there are options for music and fine arts once they hit high school.

### **Faith Formation**

### **Learners & Learning**

Shifting focus to talk about what the kids want and what the staff have the ability to offer. Having some solid conversations this year about what can be offered next year. A small school with small staff its difficult to offer everything that a larger school has to offer. We will still do amazing things. It will be looked at as a 5-8 group as it will be offered as a "middle school" opportunity. It may not be in the capacity that they are envisioning but maybe we can do something to bring some of these ideas to life.

- CTF (career and technology) Courses and Diverse Learning for our 5-8s - Process and Update
  - Surveyed/asked students. Grade 7&8 voices shared:
  - possibility of mixing 5/6 with 7/8 to open up two teachers for different classes.
    - Music - especially the guitars
    - cosmetology (specifically hair and makeup)
    - sewing/fashion
    - Fine Arts - Focus on Technique, different materials, and not just follow tutorials.
    - More Sport options - field trips as well
    - Mechanics (there is an understanding that this is not something we have the capacity for at this time)
    - Film Studies
    - Woodworking/Carpentry (Same as mechanics)

- Staff ideas:
  - Bringing in guests/parents/experts to demonstrate
  - Bus driver & bus cost
  - Having a parent/staff with the ability to drive a school bus, as Maddy did with  $\frac{1}{8}$  class for one of their field trips.

**Budget information:**

- Budget: Schools are funded based on the following class sizes. Class sizes above this threshold add flexibility to the school's operating budget, below, it depletes the budget. Our school budget must pay for: staff salaries, replacements for staff, professional learning so staff grow in their craft, furniture & equipment, subscription and resources, repairs, advertising - to name a few.
  - 19 is break even for Grades K-4
  - 24 break even for Grades 5-8
- Current registration grade #
  - PreK - Up to 6 (3 registered for here, but their programming will be PUF at MCS)
  - Kindergarten: 16 (8 new families) -3
  - Grade 1: 16 (2 new families) -3
  - Grade 2: 9 (1 new family) -10
  - Grade 3: 18 -1
  - Grade 4: 16 -3
  - Grade 5: 19 -5
  - Grade 6: 11 -13
  - Grade 7: 12 (1 new family) -12
  - Grade 8: 10 -14 **Total -64**
  - PreK & K Nature Extension Program = currently 9 people interested need 13 to break even and possibly run it \*\*Lisa Baker and I have had lots of collaborative discussions about mutually beneficial directions. She is supportive of where we're going, and it's most cost effective for families because of the change in funding (grant or subsidy)
