

#### REQUIRED ATHLETIC FORMS

- 3. IHSAA PPE Physician Questions (to be completed prior to physical examination)
- 4. Consent for Medical Care
- 5. Athletic Code of Conduct
- 6. ProRehab Consent and Release
- 7. Concussion & Cardiac Arrest Awareness
- 8. IHSAA PPE Physical (paperwork can be uploaded to Final Forms)

## We will not accept any form other than the official IHSAA Pre-Participation Physical Evaluation Form (PPE).

The doctor's physical exam must be completed **on or after April 1** each year for the succeeding school year. For the 2025-2026 school year, the physical must have been completed on or after April 1, 2025. Physical Forms submitted to the CNMS Athletics Office, or uploaded to Final Forms, are good for the entire 2025-2026 school year. Students participating in multiple sports **DO NOT** need to turn in multiple physicals. Forms turned in for CNMS sponsored summer camps, practices, tryouts, or fall sports are good for that entire school year. This is in compliance with the IHSAA guidelines.

If your child has a physical that was turned into another program unaffiliated with CNMS, those physicals do NOT get sent to CNMS unless the program director/coach specifically makes it a point. This includes the Castle "Cub" (soccer, tennis, lacrosse, baseball, cross country) athletic programs.

CNMS has several athletic opportunities for students throughout the school year. All athletes must have a current physical on file in Final Forms before they are allowed to participate.

The following sports are available for students to participate in during the school year:

**FOOTBALL:** Castle Middle School Football is for 7th and 8th grade students. 6th graders who wish to play football will do so with the Castle Youth Football League.

**VOLLEYBALL:** Please visit our website for tryout dates.

**BASKETBALL:** Tryouts are typically held the last week in October/first week of November.

**WRESTLING:** Our wrestling season runs from the beginning of February, through the end of March.

**TRACK:** Our track season begins in mid-March, around the time of spring break.

The **IHSAA** required physical forms and consent and release certificate are included within this information packet. All athletes must have them completed and on file. Also, please remember to visit Final Forms to complete the necessary documents. These items **are required** for participation in athletics. For the 2025-2026 school year (including **any** school-sponsored summer camps/practices/tryouts), physicals must have been completed by a doctor on or after **April 1, 2025.** 

The school office opens 10 days prior to the students' first day of school. Parents with questions regarding our fall sports (Football & Volleyball) will need to check the Castle North MS website for tryout and schedule information.
