29 Moses came down from Mount Sinai.
As he came down from the mountain
with the two tablets of the covenant in his hand,
Moses did not know
that the skin of his face shone
because he had been talking with God.

³⁰When Aaron and all the Israelites saw Moses, the skin of his face was shining, and they were afraid to come near him.

³¹But Moses called to them; and Aaron and all the leaders of the congregation returned to him, and Moses spoke with them.

³²Afterwards all the Israelites came near, and he gave them in commandment all that the LORD had spoken with him on Mount Sinai.

³³When Moses had finished speaking with them, he put a veil on his face;

34but whenever Moses went in before the LORD to speak with him, he would take the veil off, until he came out;

and when he came out, and told the Israelites what he had been commanded, ³⁵the Israelites would see the face of Moses, that the skin of his face was shining;

and Moses would put the veil on his face again, until he went in to speak with him.

Reading the Epistle This Week

I've declined to preach this one this century – Though a dozen times on 2 Corinthians (cc.12, 4, 5, 6) Relying on Canadian Ernest Best's 1987 commentary for those

Paul corresponded with Corinth – back and forth We get one side of the exchange – on various issues In 2 Cor, likely excerpts of a couple of Paul's letters

Let's take this text in context of 2:14-7:4 How will Paul, and in turn Corinth and us, Mediate or communicate from mundane to sublime? He's coming to 'earthen vessels' next in c.4

The argument about how to construe Moses' veil tales
Is vulnerable to anti-Semitic tropes
When Paul writes as a Jew affirming Torah,
Encouraging 'us' to remove our own veil

v.16b was a popular 'bumper sticker' slogan, back when the UCC still included charismatic folks, our roots in the 'holiness' movement

4.1-2 got more mileage in our 'sex wars' of the 80's

Both in celebration of coming out

And in denouncing of those still shamed and closeted

In glib liberal trust that given light and air truth will prevail

Luke 9:28-36, (37-43)

28 Now about eight days after these sayings Jesus took with him Peter and John and James, and went up on the mountain to pray.

²⁹And while he was praying, the appearance of his face changed, and his clothes became dazzling white.

³⁰Suddenly they saw two men, Moses and Elijah, talking to him.

³¹They appeared in glory and were speaking of his departure, which he was about to accomplish at Jerusalem.

> ³²Now Peter and his companions were weighed down with sleep; but since they had stayed awake, they saw his glory and the two men who stood with him.

³³Just as they were leaving him,
Peter said to Jesus,
'Master, it is good for us to be here;
let us make three dwellings,
one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah'
—not knowing what he said.

³⁴While he was saying this, a cloud came and overshadowed them; and they were terrified as they entered the cloud.

> ³⁸Just then a man from the crowd shouted, 'Teacher, I beg you to look at my son; he is my only child.

³⁹Suddenly a spirit seizes him, and all at once he shrieks. It throws him into convulsions until he foams at the mouth; it mauls him and will scarcely leave him.

⁴⁰I begged your disciples to cast it out, but they could not.'

⁴¹Jesus answered,
'You faithless and perverse generation,
how much longer must I be with you
and bear with you?
Bring your son here.'

⁴²While he was coming, the demon dashed him to the ground in convulsions.

But Jesus rebuked the unclean spirit, healed the boy, and gave him back to his father.

⁴³And all were astounded at the greatness of God.)

Enjoy Luke's version of Transfiguration this year – (we'll miss it, following the UCC 100th service from UCW)

Luke mostly matches Matt/Mk,

Placing Transfig between 1st and 2nd passion prediction

Sure, we get the type and examples –
Moses, Elijah, Jesus
How do they straddle or bridge
For us to share, or simply to observe?

Notice the 'sleepy disciples' addition – Setting up a replay in Gethsemane in Luke 22 Directed surely at Luke's community and us in turn!

I only seemed to use the Torah in Year C twice this century, but appear to repeatedly try Luke's version of Transfiguration, in 2007, 2010, 2013, 2016, 2019, and 2022:
