They both were involved in contacting the student's families and in visiting the students after they were taken to the hospital, and helped make arrangements for the parents to come, as well as making sure the health insurance company was notified. They visited the students regularly and checked in to make sure that any needs were addressed; this included helping the parents when they arrived and helping them as needed. The injuries sustained by the students were very serious and one was paralyzed below the waist permanently. Stacey and Lucy handled this emergency situation with care and calm and were the "rock" that everyone needed in this time of need. They responded immediately and took leadership in initiating the contacting of family, faculty and staff. This was a time when I was out of the country and some other office staff members were also not on campus, but they did not hesitate to act. Their work exemplifies what the ISS team is great at...meeting student needs with responsiveness, care and commitment, and following through to make sure that things are done right. Our ISS department staff regularly does this, and the efforts of Stacey and Lucy are the most recent and outstanding example of this-they deserve to be acknowledged for their excellent work.

Jocelyn is a full-time AmeriCorps member serving in the Learn and Serve Environmental Anthropology Field (LEAF) School. The LEAF School is a service-learning program in the anthropology department that uses traditional ecological knowledge and skills to solve contemporary problems. Jocelyn leads a peer-to-peer and a college student to youth mentoring program for the LEAF School. Her mentors lead other students through projects such as installing the new Place of Medicine (stolja ali) ethnobotanical garden in Gold Park, ethno-botanical harvest and restoration projects with local tribes and non-profit organizations and wildlife monitoring for local land trusts and government agencies. She has connected college student mentors to Native American mentees in Edmonds School District, assisted with an alternative winter break by taking 15 mentors to Kettle Falls to teach wildlife tracking skills to fourth graders and high school students, hosted a traditional ecological knowledge alternative spring break on Whidbey and Hope Islands for Native American high school students and coordinated volunteers at the Native American Student Association's powwow. By June 30, the end of her eleventh month term, Jocelyn will have served the Edmonds CC community for about 2,000 hours, well above and beyond the 1,700 expected of full-time AmeriCorps members. She has provided outstanding service that will impact our students and community for years to come. BRAVO Jocelyn!
