Peer Tutor Guidelines and Expectations

Thank you for your interest in becoming a student peer tutor at Scott High School! As a student peer tutor, you will be expected to act as a role model for other students within both the classroom and the school building as a whole. **As a role model, it is important that peer tutors are self disciplined, responsible, organized, respectful, patient, and punctual.** If these descriptors apply to you, then you are exactly the person we are looking for!

As a student peer tutor at Scott, you may be asked to do the following:

- Assist students with their class work (NOT just telling them the answers, teaching the skills or giving examples so that they are able to complete the work on their own)
- Guide students on classroom behavior (Set a good example for the underclassmen and students you are working with.)
- Read and/or write for particular students
- Respect peer confidentiality
- Work with students on motor skills
- Assist students with community and employability skills
- Assist students with daily living skills
- Data collection
- Other assignments and/or activities deemed appropriate by supervising teacher

As a student peer tutor at Scott, you will be expected to do the following:

- Serve as a role model to others
- Take initiative to assist both teacher and students in the classroom to enhance student learning
- Follow instructions (stay in the room you are assigned, etc.)
- Be polite and well mannered at all times
- **Maintain the confidentiality of the students whom you work with!**

Again, thank you for your interest in being a Student Peer Tutor at Scott High School. After you return your application, you will be contacted to schedule an interview.

Note: Students may not be a Peer Tutor for more than one class period per trimester. Students may not be a Teacher Aide or Office Aide and a Peer Tutor in the same trimester.
