Letter from Victoria in regards to Troop 52 Volunteering

Thanks for your quick response. For this upcoming Saturday Sept 10th we may only have one or two scouts available because there isn't enough time to get the info into our weekly e-newsletter. But for October 8th we should be able to organize and have more Scouts available. On November 12th we are away on a campout unfortunately but perhaps in December we could coordinate again.

As for types of projects, we have a decent idea of the type of work you do in our parks. Our Scouts can help with anything but I know that many will be particularly interested in volunteering for conservation type projects (helping to conserve wildlife, energy, forests, soil, and water). Some conservation project ideas might be:

- Conducting a stream, river or lakeside trash collection project
- Conduct stream improvement projects to prevent erosion.
- Plant shrubs to provide food and cover for wildlife.
- Plant tree seedlings as part of a managed forestry plan.
- Plant grasses and legumes to provide ground cover in park and recreation areas.
- Help thin and prune woodlands in a managed tree improvement project.
- With a local forester, take part in or conduct a forest fire prevention program.
- Assist a local forester in a tree insect- and disease-control or public education project.
- Participate in a wildlife or wildfowl count.
- Develop a nature trail in a park.

Maybe some of these conservation project ideas dovetail with future park projects you might have in the works? We are also open to other ideas you might have!
