Art Exploratory (Semester)	This course introduces students to the elements of
	art through a variety of media that may include:
	drawing, painting, printmaking, mixed media,
	pottery and weaving. Application of these elements
	to the students' own original artwork is the major
	emphasis while being introduced to art history and
	critical analysis of master work as well as their own.

	Illustrate the importance of well-prepared and
	trained babysitters and how to prepare for the
	diverse responsibility of being a babysitter. Gain the
	knowledge and skills for careers in early childhood
	education.
Beginning Chorus (Semester or <b>Year-Long</b> )	Students apply correct singing technique and
	various elements of musical expression through
	developmentally appropriate and historic vocal
	literature. Students learn how to use traditional
	notation in order to learn music, and to respond
	correctly to conductors' gestures both in rehearsal
	and public performance. Students will study vocal
	music and its relationship to other cultures, eras

	and geographical locations.
Computer Science Discoveries I (Semester)	Students will use a problem-solving process to
	address a series of puzzles, challenges, and
	real-world scenarios. They will learn how computers
	input, output, store, and process information to
	help humans solve problems. Students will also
	learn how to create and share the content on their
	own web pages using HTML and CSS. They will also
	practice valuable programming skills such as
	debugging, using resources, and teamwork.
Evaluring Animal and Dlant Science (Semester)	Explore the fundamentals of the animal and plant
Exploring Animal and Plant Science (Semester)	· ·
	industry through classroom and exploratory
	settings. Foster an understanding of the
	importance of plant and animal products through
	hands-on activities. Generate knowledge of play
	physiology in laboratory settings. Build
	leadership and employability skills through

Introduction to Theatre (Semester)	This course is an overview of dramatic techniques.
	Students develop communication skills through
	study in dialogue, pantomime, improvisation,
	speech/diction, and role play. In this beginning
	class, students learn the foundations of acting,
	puppetry, technical theatre, playwriting, theatre
	history and dance for actors. Students will perform
	in the <i>Bengal PlayFest</i> at the end of the semester
	for friends & family.
Keyboarding and Basic Word	Students develop a foundation for effective
Processing (Semester)	technology use by learning to type. The curriculum
Trocessing (Semester)	covers topics and skills including keyboard layout,
	ergonomic strategies, and keyboarding proficiency.
	Students also learn to use word processing software
	for basic document creation, design, editing,
Chanish haginning Vary 1 /Competers	collaboration, and problem solving.
Spanish beginning Year 1 (Semester)	This course begins the study of the Spanish
	language and culture and is the first part in the
	Spanish curriculum series for high school credit.
	Major topics include greetings, conversation
	questions, telling time, classroom objects, asking for
	help, the parts of the body, infinitive verbs,

expressing likes and dislikes, definite and indefinite
articles, adjectives, subject pronouns, the present
tense of –ar verbs, and the plurals of nouns and
articles. Students who successfully complete this
course should continue the Spanish curriculum
series for high school credit by taking Intermediate
Spanish.
