Story Interpretation

Tasks

- 1. Find a portion of a story that you can visualize in three dimensions.
- 2. Write a paper explaining interpretation and criticism.
- 3. Write the Description, Analysis and Interpretation before starting the sculpture.
- 4. Create a sculpture using any media interpreting the story.

Paper Requirements

- Use 12 pt, Times New Roman, Double Space, one page in length
- On the last page include the work cited.
- Type, print or photocopy the portion of the story you are interpreting.
- Create a Sculpture using any media.
- Have your rough draft proofread by someone before turning in your final paper.

Structure of written paper

Write the Description, Analysis and Interpretation before starting the sculpture.

Description

- Write the title and author of the story
- Write a brief summary of the story. Use a paragraph or so, depending on the story length.
- After the summary, write the exact parts of the story that you are interpreting.

Analysis & Interpretation

- What are the most important messages or visual descriptions in the story to reflect in your sculpture?
- Explain your interpretation of the message and/or visual descriptions.
- What emotion, if any, needs to be translated into your sculpture and how should it be done?

Reflection of construction

- How did your construction go? What did you struggle with (materials, interpretation)? What went really well?
- Do you think you communicated your story well? Would the viewer understand the message from the important part of the story?

Judgment

- What is the most successful aspect of your sculpture and what could use further improvement?
- What elements and principles helped make this piece successful and are important to this piece. Explain why.
- Would you consider your work an original piece? Why or why not?
