We've talked about most of our committees over the past year. Please reach out if you have questions about any committees! Today we discussed Membership, Helfeld, and Performers' Showcase.

Membership and Helfeld are always looking for additional support. Helfeld is a great shorter commitment, mostly focused in the spring when they review applications.

Performers' Showcase is chaired by Armin and three other ACL members, Sheila, Diana, and Renee. It's a pretty intense commitment from August until February. The committee reviews applications and decides who will perform at the Showcase, as well as run the program day-of, usually on a Sunday in February. They would be happy to have new people join!

Impromptu Discussion of Ohlone Representation in Children's Books

We had an impromptu discussion about Ohlone representation in kids' books (inspired by Berkeley Public Library's new land acknowledgement announcement), as well as library programming and connections with Ohlone groups and performers. Sogorea Te' Land Trust is a great online resource with lots of information, although most of it is geared towards adults and teens. Ohlone Sisters and Café Ohlone have partnered with Bay Area public libraries (San Francisco and Berkeley) on various programs.

10:45-11:30: **Professional Development: ALA Conference share:** Please join us for a roundtable discussion of highlights from the American Library Association Annual Conference.

Session highlight: Where Are the Arab American Voices in Children's Literature. They had good visuals and they reminded people that Muslims are not necessarily Arab (or Arab American). How can we do better in our displays and information about Arabs and Arab Americans? Especially for heritage month and holiday displays.

Freedom to Read celebration was really inspiring. ALA in general was a really lovely celebration of authors loving libraries and librarians loving authors. It was generally a really good and inspiring time.

There's just so much going on – you can go to panels, chase down authors, go to awards, and more. Lots of books and swag to bring back and share with classroom kids.

Graphic Novels Round Table Magical Comics Tea. The creators go around from table to table and you get to talk to them for about four minutes. It was a great way to really hear from different creators and be in a more intimate setting.

Also shout out to all the fabulous folks in ACL who are involved in ALA as well and have done really fabulous work there!

Black creators panel was a great event, but it was at a bad point in the schedule of events.

Armin was on the Newbery committee this year and got to meet so many authors and hear about their experiences of winning this award. ALA is making it easier to be on an

award committee, you just have to fill out a form instead of it being an election.

Shani went to a good virtual ALA session on recorded (audio) books and heard about how they make recorded books for graphic novels. They actually write a slightly different script in order to maintain the flow of the story in a recorded version. Rachael recommended *Mexikid* as an audio graphic novel that was an excellent adaptation of the printed book.

Other conferences: School Library Journal event in November is a great smaller conference, especially for school librarians. ALA Midwinter/LibLearnX was a great experience and chance to meet some awesome authors and discuss freedom to read. Brianna was on the Alex Award committee last year and had a nice experience doing that work. An impactful session at LibLearnX was on open-ended creation programs for kids as a way to process emotions.
